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INTRODUCTION

This document continues the series of annual estimates of Maine's population, prepared and published by the Office of Data, Research, and Vital Statistics. Estimates of the population in five age groups are given for each minor civil division (MCD) in the State of Maine. Organized MCDs are arranged in alphabetical sequence within each county, and summaries of each county are displayed as well. Some of the unorganized MCDs are clustered as a single unit of population. The clustered MCDs follow the organized minor civil divisions.

Special acknowledgement is due to the agencies which supplied some of the input data used in the preparation of these population estimates. Religious school enrollment data were supplied by each religious school. Non-religious school enrollment data were supplied by the Department of Education and Cultural Services. Housing unit data were supplied by the Bureau of Taxation from a file prepared by the Center for Housing and Land Use, University of Southern Maine. County controls used in these estimates were prepared by the United States Census Bureau. Additional thanks go to the members of the advisory panel who worked with us to assure the accuracy and validity of our methodology.

HIGHLIGHTS

Total Population:

The estimated population of the State of Maine on July 1, 1989, was 1,216,052. This is an increase of 91,009 or 8.1 percent since April 1, 1980. The number of births exceeded the number of deaths by 54,129 between April 1, 1980, and July 1, 1989. The number of in-migrants exceeded the number of out-migrants by 36,880. During the 12 month period between July 1, 1988, and July 1, 1989, the natural increase was 6,135 and the net migration was 4,296 inward.

County Populations:

All counties except Aroostook increased in population between April 1, 1980, and July 1, 1989. The largest increase in county population was 26,863 in Cumberland County. The largest decrease was a reduction of 6,308 people in Aroostook County.

Twelve of the 16 counties had a net migration inward. The largest net migration inward was 15,354 in Cumberland County. The largest net migration outward was 11,562 in Aroostook County.

Minor Civil Division Populations (MCDs):

The State of Maine contains 913 Minor Civil Divisions. In this report, certain unorganized MCDs have been clustered, reducing the number of sub-divisions to 536. Both clustered and unique sub-divisions are referred to as MCDs.

Seventy-six percent of the 536 MCDs had an increase in population between April 1, 1980, and July 1, 1989. The largest increases in population were in the minor civil divisions of Sanford (3,166), Brunswick (2,866) and Gorham (2,816). The largest decreases in population were in Lewiston (1,762), Waterville (1,673) and Augusta (1,385).

The largest amount of net migration inward was 2,114, in the town of Sanford. The largest amount of net migration outward was 2,679, in the city of Lewiston.

The largest amount of natural increase was 2,222 in the town of Limestone. The smallest amount of natural increase was -185 in the town of Camden.

Age Group Populations:

The amount and direction of change in population from April 1, 1980, to July 1, 1989, varied among the different age groups. The preschool group, age 0-4, increased by 9,980. The school age group, age 5-17, decreased by 20,982. The young adult group, age 18-44, increased by 58,268. The older adult group, age 45-64, increased by 12,146, while the elderly, age 65+, increased by 31,597.

The age cohort who were 0-4 on July 1, 1989 had a net inward migration of 4,616. The age cohort who were 5-17 on July 1, 1989 had a net inward migration of 13,239. The age cohort who were 18-44 on July 1, 1989 had a net outward migration of 6,765. The age cohort who were 45-64 on July 1, 1989 had a net inward migration of 10,099. The age cohort who were 65 and over on July 1, 1989 had a net inward migration of 15,691.

TECHNICAL NOTES

Methodology:

The method used to produce these estimates is a component method in which the population estimate of each age cohort of each minor civil division (MCD) is equal to the 1980 census count of the cohort, plus the natural increase of that cohort, plus the estimated net migration between April 1, 1980 and July 1, 1989.

The first two components of these estimates are known data. The third component, net migration, is estimated by regression lines based on the previous decade (1970-1980). The dependent variables in this regression analysis are the migration rates of each age group in each area. The independent variables are the ratios of the difference between the actual and expected values of given symptomatic indicators of migration to the expected values. The expected values of these indicators of migration are based on United States trends. After the estimated migration rate of a given cohort of a given MCD is calculated, it is multiplied by the population base of the cohort to obtain the estimated net migration.

Ten variables were tested for use as symptomatic indicators of migration in this methodology. They were births, deaths, AFDC children, housing units, school enrollment, newlyweds, covered employment, old age assistance recipients, military enlistments and voter registration. The best three variables for each age group were selected for use as estimators of migration. Housing units, births and newlyweds were selected for the age cohort 0-4. School enrollment, births, and housing units were used for the age cohort 5-17. School enrollment, housing units, and newlyweds were the best for the age cohort 18-44.

School enrollment, newlyweds, and deaths were used for the age cohort 45-64. School enrollment, deaths and births were selected for the age cohort 65+.

Accuracy of Estimates:

Even a perfect method for estimating population would be limited by the quality of the data used to prepare it. The most important of the symptomatic indicators of net migration currently available to the ODRVS is the school enrollment data, collected in previous years by the Maine Department of Education and Cultural Services (DECS). A number of private schools (usually religious) did not regularly report enrollment to DECS. When the enrollment was known to be missing, estimates based on the last known enrollment were used, if possible; otherwise zero enrollment was used. Beginning with the year 1985, the ODRVS initiated an annual survey of religious private schools to obtain their enrollment by residence of the student. The use of these survey data has improved the quality of the input data for estimating net migration. Public school data are still obtained from DECS.

Although there are no data available for a precise measurement of the quality of these estimates, the ODRVS has attempted to assess their accuracy by comparing them with estimates prepared by the U.S. Census Bureau. Good agreement between the state and federal estimates is not positive proof of a high degree of accuracy for either estimate, but it does increase our confidence in their accuracy, especially since the two methods of estimating are very dissimilar.

This analysis of the quality of the estimates is based on an article in the American Statistician* which presents a measure called the Maximum Ratio (M). In our application, M is the absolute value of the difference between the State and Federal Estimates for an MCD, divided by the smaller of the two estimates. The concept of the Index of Accordance is also presented in this article where it is referred to as α (the Greek letter alpha). The Index of Accordance is equal to $M/(M+2)$.

The ODRVS has developed a model to use, with the Index of Accordance, as a benchmark to assess the quality of population estimates. If the Index of Accordance (I) is less than or equal to the benchmark (B), i.e. I/B is not greater than 0.75, the estimate is considered to be of acceptable accuracy. In our application, the Index of Accordance is equal to $M/(M+2)$ where M equals the absolute value of the error of estimate ratio, (state estimate minus federal estimate) : (minimum of state estimate and federal estimate). The benchmark is calculated from the equation $B = .128t/2^{\text{Log}P_{80}}$, where t = time in years between the census date and the date of estimate and P_{80} is the 1980 census count.

In 1988 officials from three towns questioned the accuracy of our estimate for 1987. As a result of these complaints, the ODRVS formed an advisory panel of eight state and local experts to advise us on methodology and adjustment procedures for outliers to improve the quality of the population estimates.

Based on the advice of the panel, beginning with 1988 estimates, a local review process was initiated in which every municipality is provided a review report containing a preliminary estimate and the input data used for calculating the natural increase and net migration (births, deaths, school enrollment, year around housing units, and newlyweds). After the review report is returned to the ODRVS with comments on the accuracy of the data, ODRVS staff make any needed corrections, recalculate the estimates, and generate a list of MCDs with an I/B ratio greater than 0.75. All of the MCDs on this list are then considered for possible adjustment as outliers. The following procedure is used in the final adjustment process.

- I. Only those MCD estimates with an I/B ratio greater than 0.75 are automatically considered for adjustment.
- II. If a primary adjustment is needed, it is made on the basis of one of the three following procedures which produces an estimated housing unit vacancy rate nearest to the 1980 vacancy rate from the census report.
 1. The original state estimate after local review.
 2. The federal estimate (U.S. Census Bureau).
 3. An average of the state and federal estimate.

III. The estimated vacancy rate (VR) is calculated from the following equation:

$$VR = (1 + (GQ - POP) / SI280 \times ChFct \times HU) \times 100, \text{ where}$$

VR is the vacancy rate as a percent.

GQ is the group quarters population, which is assumed to be the same as in the 1980 census report unless a more recent estimate is available.

SI280 is the mean household size in the 1980 census report.

ChFct is the ratio of the mean household size in the year of estimate to the 1980 size for the county in which the MCD is located. These mean estimated county household sizes are prepared by the U.S. Census Bureau. If the most recent county mean household size available is prior to the year of estimate, then an extrapolation to the year of estimate is made.

HU is the estimated number of year around housing units in the year of estimate.

POP is the estimate population for the year of estimate.

Whenever a primary adjustment is made, a corresponding secondary adjustment is also made so that the county total will remain equal to the county controls prepared by the U.S. Census Bureau. For any primary adjustment for a given MCD, another MCD in the same county, whose difference (in the same direction) between the state and federal estimate is the largest, is adjusted by the amount of the primary adjustment in the opposite direction. No more than 50% of the difference between the federal and state estimate is used for this secondary adjustment. Any remaining adjustment is taken from the MCD with the second largest difference between the state and federal estimates, etc.

*This comparison had 20 MCDs with an I/B ratio greater than 0.75 after local review. The population of one of these 20 MCDs was adjusted to equal the federal estimate; eight were adjusted to the average of the state and federal estimate. Three MCDs were removed from the list because of secondary adjustments. The remaining eight MCDs were not adjusted.
