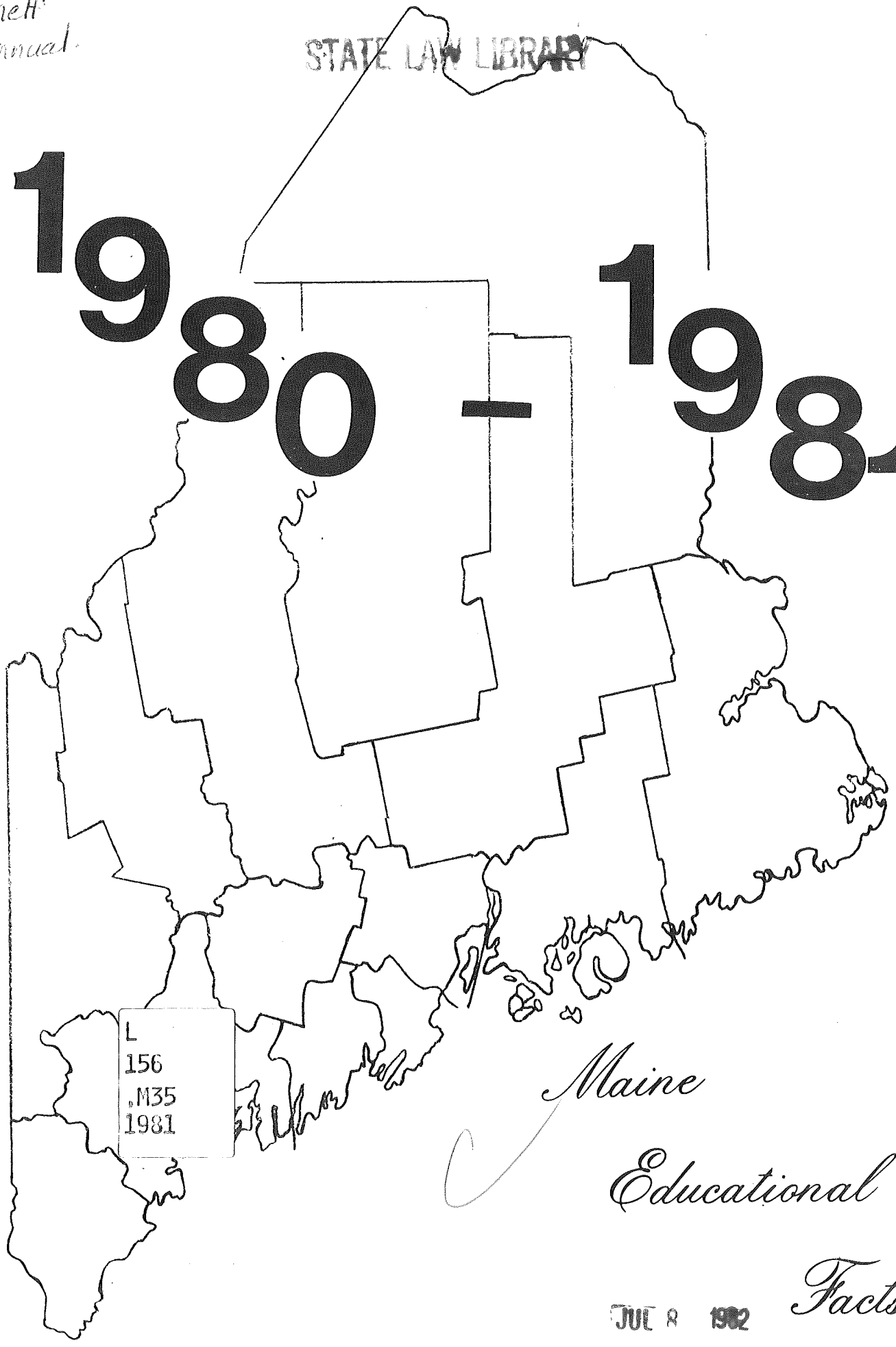

SUMMARY OF

"MAINE EDUCATIONAL FACTS"

Title 20 - Chapter 105 § 911, "Education is compulsory for pupils from age 7 to 17."

In 1980 Maine had a Fall Enrollment of 222,497 enrolled in 772 public schools (619 elementary, 103 secondary and 50 combined elementary and secondary). These students were taught by 12,476 staff members. In the Spring of 1981 the net enrollment totalled to 222,282 students. A total of 17,615 students were enrolled in private schools, 76 elementary, 23 secondary, and 53 combined elementary and secondary and taught by 1,108 teachers.

Maine's 497 towns are now divided into 74 school administrative districts with 281 towns, 34 cities and towns under individual supervision, 23 towns under district superintendents and agents of the commissioner, and 12 community school districts with 37 towns, leaving 122 towns in 35 unions.

The cost of public education continues to rise. The cost per pupil excluding transportation, capital outlay and debt service, was \$1,313.59 per elementary and \$1,641.12 per secondary.

Much has been done to encourage young people to complete their secondary education and advance into post-secondary education. Of the 17,395 high school graduates (15,554 public and 1,841 private) in 1981, 46.2% of the public high school graduates and 70% of the private high school graduates continued their education--a combined percentage of 48.7%. Approximately 70% of these are continuing their education in Maine institutions. Of the 69,920 secondary students, there were 2,924 dropouts which gave Maine a 4.2% dropout rate for the 1980-81 school year.
