133 AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE CITY OF CARIBOU TO ESTABLISH A VOTING DISTRICT IN THE UNORGANIZED TOWNSHIP OF CONNOR

- SUMMARY: Would have changed the responsibility for conducting elections in Connor from Caswell Plantation to Caribou.
- 147 AN ACT LIMITING THE TIME PERIOD Salsbury (ONTP) FOR THE ACCEPTANCE AND EXPENDI-TURE OF CAMPAIGN FUNDS BY CANDIDATES
- SUMMARY: Would have prohibited a candidate from accepting contributions or spending money to support his candidacy prior to 6 months before the election.
- 155 AN ACT TO REQUIRE PROOF OF Willey (ONTP) RESIDENCY FOR VOTER REGIS-TRATION

SUMMARY: Title of bill is self-explanatory.

- SUMMARY: Reduces the number of election clerks required at each voting place from 4 to 2. Additional clerks could be appointed where necessary.

SUMMARY: Would have prohibited the chairman of the board of registration from also being a public employee or officer in municipalities with populations of 20,000 or more; and would have permitted municipal officers to appoint deputies for boards of registration. Similar to LD 369.

SUMMARY: Would have changed to date of the Primary Election to the first Tuesday in September, including all necessary technical amendments to existing law.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (S-103): Would have changed the date of the primary to the 2nd Tuesday following the first Monday in September and required that a losing candidate in a primary who wish to file an application for a recount do so within 5 days of the election, rather than 10.
