- 492 AN ACT TO CLARIFY THE CRITERIA FOR Connolly ONTP(acc.) SUITABLE WORK IN THE UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION PROGRAM
- SUMMARY: Substitutes the term "wages" for the term "earnings" to broaden the items that will be considered in whether a claimant refuses "suitable" work and will thereby lose unemployment benefits.

- SUMMARY: Limits increase in maximum weekly unemployment benefit to 50% of the annual increase in the consumer price index, and increases the amount of wages on which unemployment taxes are paid to \$8000 per year.

- 496 AN ACT TO ADJUST THE WEEKLY BENE- Andrews LV/WD(acc.) FIT AMOUNT FOR DEPENDENTS OF UN-EMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION CLAIMANTS
- SUMMARY: Increases the weekly amount payable for each dependent of an unemployment compensation claimant from \$5 to \$15; removes the maximum limitation on dependency benefits.

SUMMARY: Pay rates for particular job classifications and classifications of jobs are made mandatory subjects of bargaining; intended to change the result of a Law Court decision holding them non-negotiable items.
