AN ACT TO ESTABLISH APPRENTICE-  
SHIP OPPORTUNITIES IN STATE GOVERN-  
MENT FOR RECIPIENTS OF THE AID TO  
FAMILIES WITH DEPENDENT CHILDREN  
PROGRAM

SUMMARY: ID 789 proposed to expand the existing apprenticeship program for recipients of AFDC that is currently included in the general apprenticeship program (open to employees in public and private enterprise) to include "apprenticeable" positions throughout State Government. The Commissioner of Personnel was required to determine all "apprenticeable" positions in State government, and by December 31, 1985 enter into Apprenticeship Agreements with AFDC recipients for 10% of the total number of positions.

Since the 10% allocation for AFDC recipients could be challenged in court on the grounds of denying protection, a target of 10% was established. In addition, an annual report requirement evaluating the AFDC participation and attrition rates was also included.

SUMMARY: ID 809 proposed to provide a right-of-way across the property of the Elizabeth Levinson Center to John Burke. The Burke property has access to State Street, but the route of access is too steep. The route of access across the Levinson Center property from the Hogan Road is in level terrain. The director of Public Improvements, is authorized to determine the route of access, the surface of the route, and the state of reasonable orderliness and attractiveness in which the route is to be maintained.
