SUMMARY: Existing law allows 10 or more customers to make a formal complaint to PUC about utility rates or service. But there is no time limit for PUC to process these, and some cases have taken years. The bill requires a decision within 9 months, the same as for a utility rate case.

- SUMMARY: Would make several changes in 35 MRSA §72, which was extensively revised in 1981 to allow publicly-owned water companies to set their own rates. The bill establishes public information requirements, sets a time schedule for filing those rates, establishes procedures for the ratepayers appeal, and utility challenge of any appeal petition.

- SUMMARY: Would have required PUC to assess present and future demand for electric space heating, and the cost of generating capacity to meet it, with a report by January 1, 1984.
- 1009 AN ACT TO ALLOW CONSUMER GROUPS TO Connolly LV/WD SOLICIT FUNDING THROUGH UTILITY BILLS
- SUMMARY: Would have allowed approved consumer organizations to enclose circulars in utility bills mailed to consumers. The organization must reimburse the utility for costs. (Modelled on a Wisconsin law).
