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SUMMARY: Would have amended the definition of telephone lines' in Title 35 to include telephone directories and allow their regulation by PUC.

SUMMARY: This agency was set up to allow the municipal, quasi-municipal and cooperative electric utilities to join together for financing and other purposes, similar to a quasi-municipal district. The bill specifies that it is a quasi-municipal corporation.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-122) authorizes the Director of the Office of Energy Resources to designate an employee to serve on the board of the Maine Municipal and Rural Electrification Cooperative Agency.

- SUMMARY: This bill parallels the nuclear decommissioning bill, passed a year ago. It requires PUC to determine the cost of spent fuel disposal, and requires establishment of a segregated spent fuel disposal trust fund, supported by regular payments from the nuclear power plant. The cost would be included in wholesale electric rates.

SUMMARY: 35 MRSA \$131.5 requires that fuel adjustment to be based on a uniform rate for all customers. The bill would have placed the same requirement on the estimated fuel costs, which are included in the base rate.

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
