SUMMARY: Extends scope of "public buildings" subject to construction plans review; allows Commissioner of Public Safety to set fees.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (H-152): Limits fee schedule to maximum of \$55, consistent with the bill's statement of fact and testimony at the hearing. (ADOPTED)

- SUMMARY: Shortens a number of dates after which abandoned property escheats to the State; provides constitutional and clearer provisions to deal with situations involving property claimed by multiple states.
- COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (H-154): Further clarifies multiple states' claims; prevents escheat of bank deposits where the depositor has other accounts which show activity during the abandonment period; allows Treasurer to delay sale of some items; further limits excessive finders' fees; adds fiscal note.

SUMMARY: Addresses constitutional infirmity in the charitable solicitations law by exempting from requirements all solicitation in behalf of bona fide religious purposes.
