1201 AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR CAUCUS AND CONVENTION ALTERNATIVE FOR MAKING NOMINATIONS FOR ELECTION

- Would have established an optional caucus convention method of SUMMARY: nominating candidates. Municipal caucuses would nominate State legislators; county caucuses would nominate county officers and District Attorneys and a State convention would nominate Gubernatorial, U.S. Senate and House of Representative Candidates.
- 1231 AN ACT TO AMEND THE ELECTION LAWS Diamond, J (OTP-AM) ENACT. PL 360
- SUMMARY: Changes the deadline for filing petitions for presidential nomination from April 1 to July 1. Shortens the review and challenge process for nominating petitions. Requires the Election Commission to notify candidates who are late in filing financial reports and establishes a grace period. Also makes a number of technical changes.
- COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (H-238): Allows the registrar to place the zip code at the top of each page of the voting list instead of by each name. (ADOPTED)
- 1289 AN ACT CONCERNING LATE FILING Conary (OID) ENACT. PL. 242 UNDER THE REFERENDUM CAMPAIGN REPORTING LAW
- SUMMARY: Establishes that the penalty for late filing of campaign reports in referenda campaigns will be computed based on the number of business days the report is late, not calendar days.
- 1300 AN ACT CONCERNING ABSENTEE Livesay (LV/WD) VOTING BY ARMED SERVICES MEMBERS
- SUMMARY: Similar to LD 1180 which was reported out by the Committee.
- Rolde (ONTP) 1301 AN ACT TO CLARIFY PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AND STATE-WIDE REFERENDA QUESTIONS WHICH APPEAR ON STATE BALLOTS
- SUMMARY: Would have required ballot questions to be written so as to be easily understood and would have required a statement of intent and One of several bills dealing with this issue which fiscal note. Committee addressed in LD 1059.
