1038 AN ACT TO IMPROVE THE EVALUA-TION OF HEARING LOSS UNDER THE Clark, H. WORKERS' COMPENSATION ACT Hayes MacEacho LV/WD(ACC.)

- SUMMARY: LD 1038 was carried over from the 1st Regular Session anticipating action on the topic by the Speaker's Select Committee on Workers' Compensation but was withdrawn when that did not occur. The LD makes it easier to collect benefits under the occupational disease law by allowing benefits for hearing loss in higher sound frequencies, where hearing loss is most common.
- 1309 AN ACT TO AMEND THE MUNICIPAL Beaulieu LV/WD(ACC.) EMPLOYEES COLLECTIVE BARGAIN-ING LAW TO MAKE MANPOWER ISSUES A MANDATORY SUBJECT OF BARGAIN-ING
- SUMMARY: The so-called "minimum manning" bill, a carryover from the lst Session, makes manpower issues for firefighters a "working condition" and therefore a negotiable subject.
- 1810 AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A MAJNE Beaulieu LV/WD(ACC.) LABOR RELATIONS LAW
- SUMMARY: LD 1810 withdrawn before public hearing; See LD 2196 for summary of a similar bill which did go to hearing.

SUMMARY: Under the workers' compensation laws an employer has a duty to transfer an employee who has suffered a compensable injury which disables him from performing his customary work to an available position that is suitable to the employee's physical condition. Some commissioners interpreted this section to mean that employers could place an injured employee in a position even if it conflicted with a negotiated contract containing seniority or other provisions. This bill states that exercise of this transfer authority shall not conflict with a collective bargaining agreement, thus protecting the seniority rights of other employees.
