1988 AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE COST OF THE 1984 SPRUCE BUDWORM SUPPRESSION PROJECT OTP-ND - LD 2233

- SUMMARY: Would establish cost at \$7,500,000. See LD 2233.
- 1989 AN ACT CONCERNING IMPLEMENTA Higgins, H OTP-ND LD2122 TION OF THE BOAT EXCISE TAX
- SUMMARY: Original bill postponed implementation of municipal watercraft excise tax for one year to permit constitutional amendment to be resubmitted to the people. See LD 2122
- 1990 AN ACT TO CREATE A MAINE Smith, C.B LV/WD STATE INCOME TAX EXEMPTION FOR TAXPAYERS WITH SPECIAL NEEDS DEPENDENTS
- SUMMARY: Would provide an additional income tax exemption for handicapped dependents.
- 2000 AN ACT TO REVISE THE FOREST Kany LV/WD FIRE SUPPRESSION TAX
- SUMMARY: Would remove September 1, 1985 one acre reporting requirement. See LD 2474.
- 2005 AN ACT TO CREATE A WATER- Scarpino REP LV/WD CRAFT USER FEE
- SUMMARY: Would establish commercial watercraft excise tax equal to 10% of Maine income tax with respect to the watercraft. Non-commercial boats would remain subject to property tax.
