SUMMARY: Replaces the Proof of Financial Responsibility Law and requires all motorists to carry insurance identification cards for presentation to law enforcement officers. Failure is a traffic infraction, with \$100 fine.

AN ACT TO INCREASE THE Pursuant to LV-WD H&S:Accepted LIMITS FOR UNINSURED Study MOTORISTS' COVERAGE IN AUTOMOBILE INSURANCE POLICIES (REPORTED PURSUANT TO A STUDY BY THE BUSINESS LEGISLATION COM-MITTEE)

SUMMARY: Increases the minimum limits of uninsured/underinsured motorists coverage from the limits in the Financial Responsibility Law (\$20,000 for bodily injury to one person, \$40,000 for bodily injuries to 2 or more people in one accident) to \$25,000/\$50,000.

2447 AN ACT TO REQUIRE MAIN- (Pursuant to (OTP-ND Hse-Adhere TENANCE OF FINANCIAL Study) (12)) to Enact RESPONSIBILITY BY ALL ND of 2085 Sen.-Adh.to Fail to Enact

SUMMARY: Makes several changes in the mechanism for assuring financial responsibility contained in the original bill: (1) removes the requirement of uniform automobile insurance identification cards; (2) removes any civil penalties, keeping only suspensions; (3) institutes a "verification card" enforcement mechanism, along the lines of the "defect cards" informally issued for certain vehicle inspection matters; (4) applies to nonresidents only if they are involved in an accident which is required to be reported; (5) removes the automatic "proof" requirement for violators; and (6) adds an allocation from the Highway Fund for administration, and a fiscal note showing income from reinstatement fees in excess of the allocation.
