2111 AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR Pearson OTP  
FILLING VACANCIES IN THE ENACT PL C. 698  
OFFICE OF PRESIDENTIAL  
ELECTORS NOMINATED BY  
PETITION

SUMMARY: Provides for the filling of vacancies in the office of Presidential Elector for a third or non party candidate who has been nominated by petition.

2176 AN ACT TO AMEND THE Study Bill OTP-AM  
POLITICAL ACTION COMMITTEE ENACT PL C. 725  
REGISTRATION AND REPORTING  
LAW

SUMMARY: Makes a number of technical clarifications in the PAC registration and in reporting law enacted last Session. The most important changes are a reduction in the number of required reports and the standardization of reporting dates.

HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" (H-569): Exempted candidate and party committees from the definition of a PAC and added an emergency preamble. (ADOPTED)

2331 AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE McBreaarty ENG W/O REF  
COUNTY COMMISSIONERS TO ENACT PL C. 717  
ESTABLISH SEPARATE VOTING  
PLACES IN UNORGANIZED  
TOWNSHIPS

SUMMARY: Repeals the law requiring certain municipalities to establish voting places in the unorganized townships of Connor, Kingman, Rockwood Strip and Sinclair and establishes a framework in which county commissioners may provide or contract with municipalities to provide voting places for any unorganized township upon a sufficient showing of interest.

SENATE AMENDMENT "A" (S-333): Corrects the number of ballot clerks which are required to be appointed when a voting place is established and adds an emergency preamble. (ADOPTED)

SENATE AMENDMENT "B" (S-339): Requires county commissioners to notify the Secretary of State when they establish or discontinue a voting place. (ADOPTED)
