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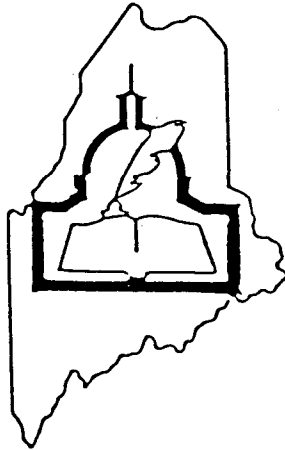

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2356	AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE HOSPITAL ADMINISTRATIVE DISTRICT NO. 1 AND HOSPITAL ADMINISTRATIVE DISTRICT NO. 4 TO ENGAGE IN A JOINT VENTURE FOR THE PURPOSE OF OWNING AND OPERATING A REGIONAL MOBILE COMPUTERIZED AXIAL TOMOGRAPHY SCAN UNIT	Locke	HSE-ENACT SEN-ENACT GOV-SIGNED P&S LAWS 83, c. 92
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SUMMARY: Because Hospital Administrative Districts are established by the Legislature, they need legislative authorization to carry out new projects. The bill authorizes Mayo Regional Hospital in Dover-Foxcroft and Penobscot Valley Hospital in Lincoln to operate a mobile CAT scanner.

2361	RESOLVE, DIRECTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES TO PREPARE DRAFT REGULATION ON THE LICENSING OF BIRTHING CENTERS		HSE-EMER ENACT SEN-EMER ENACT GOV EMERG SIGNED RESOLVES 83, c. 78
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SUMMARY: The new draft of LD 2062 directs the Department of Human Services to establish a Task Force on licensing birth centers, specifies the membership of the Task Force and the areas to be covered by the draft regulations, and requires a report to the Committee by December 1, 1984.

The House Amendment (H-624) removed legislators from the Task Force.

2365	AN ACT TO CLARIFY THE LICENSURE OF ADMINISTRATORS OF MEDICAL CARE FACILITIES OTHER THAN HOSPITALS	Brodeur	HSE-EMER ENACT SEN-EMER ENACT GOV-EMER SIGNED PL 83, c. 744
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SUMMARY: This bill was engrossed without reference, and therefore did not receive a Committee hearing. It permits the Board of Licensure of Administrators of Medical Care Facilities other than Hospitals to establish various categories of licenses for administrators of different types of medical care facilities, specifically addressing the new category of Intermediate Care Facilities for the Mentally Retarded. It also allows the Board to adopt rules for continuing educational requirements. Lastly, it reallocates a section of the statutes.
