SUMMARY:

The original bill proposed a new notice procedure for towns requiring municipal licenses for shellfish harvesting. Existing law required the publication of notice in a trade journal. The new procedure would have allowed publication of notice in a newspaper or combination of newspapers with statewide circulation. Scheduling difficulties and unnecessary expense with the use of trade journals (Commercial Fisheries News) were alleged by proponents. Proponents also felt the towns needed greater flexibility in their choice of vehicle for notice. Opponents claimed that some municipalities would subvert the intent of the law and limit public awareness of the availability of nonresident licenses. The committee report (CA H-15) incorporated a

compromise which allows towns to use newspapers with "general circulation" (striking the word "statewide") and adding a requirement that the DMR publish a semiannual summary of municipal licensing provisions in a trade journal.

SUMMARY:

This bill would have required that the DMR give every applicant for a lobster and crab license a copy of all laws and rules affecting their licensed activities. The committee rejected this proposal as too expensive. The existing system of a biennial summary of marine resources laws was judged to be adequate.

SUMMARY:

The original bill proposed a mandatory suspension of all marine resources licenses if the license holder violated any marine resources law or refused to allow inspection or seizure by marine patrol officers. The committee rejected these changes as unecessarily harsh and inflexible. The committee did approve (CA H-16) extension of the potential length of license suspensions on the first, second and third or subsequent convictions. These suspensions are imposed at the Commissioner's (DMR) discretion after conviction.
