### SUMMARY:

The Commission of Education, in accordance with state board rules, presently licenses persons who operate schools of cosmotology and barbering. This bill would have added the authority to license persons offering instruction in cosmotology and barbering to apprentices. It also stipulated that no fee could be charged for these licenses. The authorization of persons supervising apprentices in cosmotology is presently done by the State Board of Cosmotology. The bill would have eliminated this authority and transferred it to the Commissioner of Education.
