SUMMARY:

This law addresses a problem Maine truckers were experiencing carrying especially heavy objects over public ways in other states. Massachusetts, in particular, was fining Maine truckers for overweight violations, even though those loads were legally carried in accordance with Title 29, section 1703. With the enactment of this provision as an emergency, the gross weight allowed by a special overweight permit shall be deemed the registered weight of the vehicle.

SUMMARY:

This proposal attempted to mandate wearing of protective headgear, helmets, for operators of motorcycles or mopeds. The Legislature finally attempted a committee amendment which requires motorcycle operators to wear protective headgear for 2 years after passing their driving tests and, during that 2-year time frame, passengers riding with those operators must also wear protective headgear.
