The school boards of school administrative units have the authority to establish rules governing who they will hire. Some school units have specified that the spouse of a school employee may not be hired. The bill would have prohibited school boards from adopting rules which would have prohibited the hiring of spouse of a school employee.

The recognition grant stipends provided for teachers by the' September 1985 Special Session included teachers in private schools in which 60% or more of the students are public school tuition students. The bill would have made teachers in parochial schools where 60% of the students were Maine residents eligible to receive the grants.
