#### SUMMARY:

The bill put the statutes governing the Maine Committee on Aging into conformity with the amendments to the federal 1981 Older Americans' Act. Specifically, it extended the long term care ombudsman program to cover congregate housing and adult foster care facilities. The Committee Amendment (CA-S-27) removed congregate housing. The federal amendments did not specifically require inclusion of congregate housing and the Committee on Aging did not have the capacity or procedures at present needed to cover individuals in congregate housing.

SUMMARY:

Former employees of the State may withdraw their contributions on leaving State service. Under present law the State could not pay back an employees contributions earlier than 60 days after the employee terminated service. The bill requires payment in not less than 22 days and not more than 37 days after receipt of an application of termination or the date of the last payroll in which the employee was paid.
