SUMMARY:

Repeals the sunset clause on the exception to mandatory mediation for certain motions pending divorce; expands the issues that may be addressed without mediation on a motion for temporary relief pending divorce; makes it clear that when the court is shown good cause for making an exception to the mediation requirement for motions pending, the court may decide only those issues for which good cause for temporary relief has been shown; and provides sanctions for failing to mediate in good faith.
