#### SUMMARY:

A Department of Human Services bill, LD 602 was the result of a study done by the Office of Vital Statistics to assure the timely and accurate recording of deaths, burials and cremations. Several statutory changes are made to close "loops of accountability" in the handling of bodies from death to final disposition and to streamline procedures for obtaining burial-transit permits. Committee amendment "A" (H-136) addresses cases where a body will be disposed of in a way so that it cannot later be exhumed for inspection for foul play or disease.

#### SUMMARY:

The bill requires users of consumer credit reports to retain copies of credit denial notices and other records for at least 2 years, the same time period now in the Consumer Credit Code. This will give time to the Bureau of Consumer Credit Protection to inspect users' records and discover any violations of the Fair Credit Reporting Act.
