SUMMARY:

This bill would have required the award of attorney fees when a tenant wins a suit on the landlord's violation of the warranty of habitability. In addition, it would have defined any violation of the landlord-tenant laws as an unfair trade practice.

SUMMARY :

This resolve would have required the Maine State Housing Authority and the State Planning Office to conduct a study on current regulatory practices and conditions of rental housing in the various localities within the State.

Committee Amendment "A" (S-186) (Majority report) reduced the study to include only the existence, provisions in and enforcement of habitability and safety requirements in rental housing codes. A review committee would review the study and make recommendations.

House Amendment "A" (H-346) corrects the placement of a paragraph in the appropriation section.

Senate Amendment "A" (S-190) (Not adopted) would have made the correction that House Amendment "A" did.

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
