This bill would have provided more severe penalties for 2nd and 3rd and multiple OUI offenders on a graduated basis: One hundred and twenty consecutive hours; 10 days; and 45 days in jail respectively. The court would have limited suspension powers.

SUMMARY:

This bill repeals and replaces the chapter on concealed weapons. The major changes are the limiting of the permit to firearms only, making certain records available to the issuing authority and included certain juvenile crimes as disqualifications.

Committee Amendment "A" (S-194) replaces the entire bill to correct its placement in the statutes. It also extends the term of the permit from 2 years to 3 years and reduces the fee for a nonresident concealed firearms permit.
