#### SUMMARY:

This bill sought to ban smoking in indoor waiting areas, such as lobbies of professional offices, banks or other areas where members of the public are required to wait for the performance of a service and in certain places such as retail stores, museums and public schools.

#### SUMMARY:

The original resolve authorized the Superintendent of Pineland Center to establish a low-cost elderly housing project at Pineland. The committee amendment (H-245) replaced the entire bill and its title. The new resolve, "To Create a Special Commission to Study the Utilization of Vacant Buildings at Pineland Center", created a special commission to study the utilization of the vacant buildings at Pineland Center and report to the Legislature not later than January 10, 1986.

#### SUMMARY

This bill sought to establish procedures for the investigation and inspection of health care facilities by state agencies and officials. These procedures would have required 24 hour advance notice, a minimum of 2 state officials for inspections and would have prohibited inspections and investigations other than during normal business hours. Emergency exceptions had to be presented in writing to the owner or administrator.
