SUMMARY:

- This bill provides that all persons who are empowered by the county to serve criminal process, to arrest and prosecute offenders and to deal with prisoners shall be designated as deputy sheriffs.
- This bill provides that a deputy who becomes a public employee comes under the Municipal Public Employees Labor Relations Law. In such case:
 - It requires that deputies be reappointed unless there is just cause for not doing so.

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If the deputy is not to be rehired the matter is to be brought before the county commissioners, who again must decide based on just cause.

Committee Amendment A changes the placing of commas to better reflect the intent of the bill.

Committee of Conference Amendment A eliminates the provision of the bill which requires that all persons who deal with prisoners shall be deputy sheriffs. It simplifies the wording of the sections dealing with reappointment of deputies and eliminates the subject of initial appointment.

It is the intent of the bill to recognize that certain deputies will not qualify for the provisions of the bill, since they will not qualify as public employees and, thus, not be under collective bargaining. Chief deputies and part-time deputies are most likely not to qualify.

Senate Amendment A is identical to the Committee of Conference Amendment.
