SUMMARY :

LD 1063 was the Speaker's bill on workers' compensation reform and incorporated suggestions made by the Speaker's Select Committee on Workers' Compensation. Highlights of the bill included the adoption of a uniform benefit scheme for permanent impairment benefits based on 75% of the state average weekly wage; providing for the coordination of workers' compensation benefits with other disability or pension benefits under an employer-financed employee benefit plan; repealing the requirement that the Workers' Compensation Commission use court reporters to transcribe testimony at hearings; permitting the Chairman of the Workers' Compensation Commission to set discovery timetables by rule; limiting the award of attorneys' fees to only those cases in which the employee prevails or the action is initiated by the employer or insurer; and providing for a comprehensive rehabilitation system under the Workers' Compensation Commission. LD 1634 is a new draft of this bill and incorporates much of the original bill.
