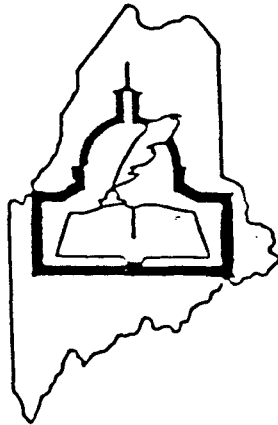

SUMMARY:

This bill sought to exempt agencies which provide home-based early intervention and prevention services from regulations governing the licensing and functioning of home health care services. When it appeared that these agencies could apply to the department for a waiver on an individual basis, the bill was granted leave to withdraw.

SUMMARY:

This bill created a Commission to study social and health services for the homeless. The committee amendment (S-108) amended the composition of the commission and added a provision to allow the commission to accept funds, gifts, and grants. The commission must report to the 2d Regular Session of the 112th Legislature.
