SUMMARY:

The bill requires stockholder approval for the investment of more than \$10 million by any electric utility in a new generating facility or the fuel conversion or expansion of an existing facility.

SUMMARY:

The bill orders study of the impact of mandatory local measured service on the various groups of residential and business customers. The study would be conducted by the Joint Standing Committee on Utilities. Survey research would be contracted by the Public Advocate with a budget of \$25,000 from the PUC Regulatory Fund. Local measured service is delayed until July 1, 1986.

This new draft of LD 151 makes the present law concerning protection of underground facilities applicable to state and state aid highway construction and maintenance activities performed by state maintenance forces, except for installation and maintenance of signs. The rest of the original bill is dropped.
