This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees of the Maine Legislature, covering the First Regular Session of the 112th Legislature. The summaries are arranged by LD number and indexed separately by committee.

SUMMARY:

The bill repealed the statuatory minimum size provisions for scallops. This issue is now covered by federal regulations which are subject to intermittant change.

SUMMARY:

The bill proposed to limit the duration of aquaculture leases to 5 years. Renewal of the lease would be conditioned on a finding by the Commissioner (DMR) the the renewal "constitutes the best economic use of that site". The majority of the committee felt that this was an unreasonable restriction of aquacultural operations.

SUMMARY:

New draft of LD 31. The original bill proposed changes in the tagging procedures for the sport salmon fishery. The bill further proposed a requirement for some salmon stocking in all salmon rivers identified in Title 12, §6255. The new draft dropped both of these proposals and substituted language that would allow the Atlantic Sea-run Salmon Commission to allocate salmon smolt to aquaculture operations. The bill was indefinately postponed on the motion of its sponsor.

SUMMARY:

.The bill proposed an amendment to the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Compact. The primary purpose of the amendment was to establish independant rule-making authority for the Compact. The value of this would have been to streamline the administration of fisheries conservation measures adopted under Compact authority. The amendment further proposed a system of cross-deputizing law enforcement personnel among member states and the federal government (see LD775). The committee voted to hold the bill over for the 2nd Regular Session of the 112th Legislature.

The bill would have required that an aquaculture lease be granted only with the advice and consent of the Marine Resources Advisory Council. The committee granted the sponsor leave to withdraw on the grounds that such a change would have given the Council quasi-judicial powers inconsistent with its overall purpose and mandate.
