SUMMARY:

The bill would have provided an exemption from the DEP oil-booming requirements for Searsport harbor. This would have effectively overturned a Board of Environmental Protection order requiring booming of ships unloading oil in Searsport. Proponents argued that the BEP decision was based on faulty assumptions and should be overturned. Opponents argued that such action would establish a precedent of allowing disatisfied parties to a BEP decision to appeal to the Legislature instead to the courts. The majority of the Committee recommended that the bill ought not to pass. This report was accepted by the Senate. The minority report, ought to pass, was accepted by the House. A floor amendment in the House (H-207) removed the emergency preamble from the However, the bill died between the House and Senate. bill.
