SUMMARY:

The bill requires certain emergency services to provide toll-free incoming telephone lines, under flat rates to be established by PUC at the marginal cost of that service. The qualifying emergency services are: fire, police, emergency rescue, hospital emergency room, and licensed regional

emergency mental health services.

SUMMARY:

The bill allows the PUC to issue temporary orders in cases involving 10-party complaints (35 MRSA §291); PUC-initiated investigations (§296); or rate adjustments (§298) (not regular rate cases). If a hearing is not held before the order, one shall be held within 60 days.

The committee amendment (S-142) is a new draft. Present law requires PUC to hold a formal hearing before it can issue an order in certain cases. The amendment authorizes them to issue a temporary order in special circumstances pending completion of a formal proceeding. It also allows the PUC to establish an accelerated procedure to determine whether a temporary order should be issued.
