SUMMARY:

This bill would have allowed the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation to contract with selected individuals and professional corporations of psychologists or psychiatrists for mental health services.

SUMMARY:

The original bill sought to fund the establishment of hospital based Suspected Child Abuse and Neglect Committees monitoring specialized family support teams within the State's 5 major medical centers. The family support team evaluates children who are victims of physical abuse, failure to thrive or neglect, sexual abuse, emotional abuse, substance abuse, chemically related or caused abuse. evaluations result in a family diagnosis and recommendations for treatment and follow-up. Child protective services workers within the Department of Human Services would be part of the team but must comply with the recommendations of the team.

The committee amendment (H-390) clarified the functions and procedures of the hospital based child abuse and neglect committees. It provides money for the department to fund team managers for the committee. It requires DHS staff to work with the team and "sign" the case plan.

The House amendment (H-397) made it clear that the hospital will hire the team manager.

The Senate amendment (S-358) removed the appropriation section as funding for this Act was included in the Part II Budaet.
