SUMMARY:

This bill reduces from 300 and 500 yards to 50 yards the amount of latitude operators of ATV's have to operate on or cross a public way and it makes clear reference to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12, section 7901, which specifies that unlawful operation of an ATV is a Class E crime.

SUMMARY:

The purpose of this bill is to establish a muzzle-loading open season for bucks only during the first 5 business days of December. This season is repealed after the 1985 hunting season.

Committee Amendment A has the following purposes:

1. Eliminates the provision of the bill which would have changed the allowed caliber of the muzzle loading guns from 40 to 45;

2. Changes a statutory reference;

3. Makes the schedule of fees \$7 for residents, \$25 for nonresident citizens and \$50 for nonresident aliens;

4. Eliminates a specific provision regarding antlerless deer and gives the commissioner the same authority as he has over the regular season;

5. Makes the season the 6 hunting days after the regular season rather than Monday to Friday of the first week of December;

6. Eliminates the repeal provision; and

7. Adds a fiscal note indicating that the fees to be charged will increase revenues by \$4,375 yearly.
