### SUMMARY:

The purpose of this new draft is to establish a Social Services Transportation Review Committee, incorporating recommendations made by the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation. The Social Services Transportation Review Committee shall conduct a general review of the issue of social services transportation and report to the 2nd Regular Session of the 112th Legislature. That report shall include legislation necessary to implement statutory changes and appropriation requests to carry out the recommendations of the review committee.

#### SUMMARY :

This bill is the product of major study effort conducted by the Transportation Committee in the Summer of 1984. Provisions within this Act place stricter control over the use of dealer plates, increase fees for engaging in the business of selling new or used cars, require motor vehicle dealers to post surety bonds, and strengthen the capability of the Division of Motor Vehicles to monitor and service motor vehicle dealers. Additional personnel are added to the Bureau of Motor Vehicles and increased costs are absorbed by increases in the titling fee from \$7.50 to \$10.00 and by other fee increases related to dealer licenses.

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
