JOINT STANDING COMMITTEE BILL SUMMARIES MAY 1986

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature, covering the Second Regular Session of the 112th Legislature. The summaries are arranged by LD number under each committee.

All Amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H-584 or S-222), together with the sponsor if it is a floor amendment or the designation "CA" if it is a committee amendment. If the amendment was adopted in the House, the letter H appears after the sponsor. If it was adopted in the Senate, the letter S appears.

Final action for each bill is listed to the right of the title. If final House action and Senate action differ, both are listed.

<u>SUMMARY:</u> LD 1698 proposed to restrict the authority of harbor masters by rescinding their power to make arrests and carry a weapon. This restriction would remove the requirement for a harbor master to complete law enforcement training provided by the Criminal Justice Academy.

The purpose of the bill is to enable municipalities to employ harbor masters who occupy the position primarily as a position of honor or to serve principally as a coordinator and as a regulator of harbor activities for a very limited period of time (3 months).

One police officer who also serves as a harbor master for Brunswick, testified against the bill. He pointed out that the drug trade, illegal trade along the coast, and search and seizure activities require harbor masters to be well trained for these situations.

The State Government Committee approved the bill. In the Committee's opinion, the bill is permissive and allows municipalities to provide harbor masters with police powers where needed. Municipalities may also choose to use municipal police to assist harbor masters who are not empowered with police powers.

LD 1718 AN ACT TO ADJUST THE RATE OF COMPENSATION OF THE MEMBERS OF THE MAINE HEALTH CARE FINANCE COMMISSION

SUMMARY: LD 1718 proposed to increase the level of per diem compensation from \$100 per day to \$150 per day to be paid to members of the Health Care Finance Commission. The legislation creating the Health Care Finance Commission (HCFC) in 1983 provided for a per diem of \$150 for HCFC members. The \$150 rate was reduced to \$100 in 1984 by legislation (P.L. 1983, c. 812) emanating from a study conducted by the Joint Standing Committee on State Government which analyzed boards and commissions throughout state government.

The State Government Committee study examined powers, duties, and responsibilities of boards and commissions. The boards are categorized according to the powers, duties, and responsibilities, and the standards for compensation are provided in the law.

LD 1718 proposed to make the Health Care Finance Commission the highest paid board in state government. Although this board has significant powers, duties, and responsibilities, there are other boards with similar powers and responsibilities that are paid much less in per diem. In addition, appointments to boards and commissions is considered an honor. Unofficial policy has been to pay per diem rates that do not reflect current market rates for similar duties and responsibilities paid in the private sector.

LD AN ACT TO AMEND THE MAINE COMMUNITY SERVICES 1743 ACT

PL 1985 c. 527

SUMMARY: LD 1743 proposed a number of technical changes to the statutory provisions governing the operation of the Division of Community Services. Most of the proposed changes were minor. For example, the term "weatherization" has been replaced with "energy conservation." Another more substantive change removes from the Community Services Advisory Board, an elected municipal official who is a local program operator of the fuel assistance program. The local program operator is replaced by a municipal official informed about the concerns of community action agencies.

A committee amendment which was adopted provides a penalty for any recipient who misuses fuel assistance or uses fraudulent means to qualify for fuel assistance.
