

JOINT STANDING COMMITTEE BILL SUMMARIES MAY 1986

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature, covering the Second Regular Session of the 112th Legislature. The summaries are arranged by LD number under each committee.

All Amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H-584 or S-222), together with the sponsor if it is a floor amendment or the designation "CA" if it is a committee amendment. If the amendment was adopted in the House, the letter H appears after the sponsor. If it was adopted in the Senate, the letter S appears.

Final action for each bill is listed to the right of the title. If final House action and Senate action differ, both are listed.

<u>SUMMARY:</u> The bill dissolves Vocational Region 6 and provides a mechanism for distributing the assets among the member communities.

LD AN ACT TO AMEND THE SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION LAW 1756

H-528 CA H S

SUMMARY: This bill makes 2 technical changes in the school construction law regarding local approval of construction projects. First, the bill eliminates the requirement that an order placing a school construction article on the ballot be filed with the municipal clerk 35 days prior to the vote. Second, the bill amends the provisions governing the language which must appear on the ballot. Currently, the ballot must state the amount of "the local share of debt service allocation." That amount cannot be calculated until after the bonds have been issued. The bill requires the ballot to indicate that the local unit is responsible for the local share of the debt service allocation.

CA-H-528: The Committee Amendment added an emergency preamble and effective date clause to the bill so that it will be in effect in time for the next series of votes on construction projects.
