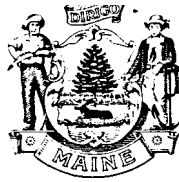

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature, covering the Second Special Session and the Third Special Session of the 112th Legislature. The summaries are arranged by LD number under each committee.

All Amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H-584 or S-222), together with the sponsor if it is a floor amendment or the designation "CA" if it is a committee amendment. If the amendment was adopted in the House, the letter H appears after the sponsor. If it was adopted in the Senate, the letter S appears.

Final action for each bill is listed to the right of the title. If final House action and Senate action differ, both are listed.

LD        AN ACT TO REGULATE THE SALE OF LOBSTER TAILS

Sponsor: CROWLEY  
Committee Report: OTP

SUMMARY: The bill reenacts provisions of state law regulating the sale of frozen lobster tails. These provisions were repealed automatically in the spring of 1986 by the terms of a statutory repeal clause included in the original law. The Department of Marine Resources reported to the Legislature that no enforcement problems had been encountered.

Committee Report: OTP

SUMMARY: The bill, which was engrossed without reference to committee, delayed the effective date of new atlantic salmon regulatory provisions dealing with tagging, licensing and catch registration.
