Final action for each bill is listed to the right of the title. If final House action and Senate action differ, both are listed.

<u>SUMMARY:</u> The United States Food Service Act of 1985, Public Law 99-198, Section 1324, requires the Secretary of State of every state to establish and operate a central filing system for the recording of notices of security interests in farm products.

In the absence of such a central state filing system which meets the criteria of the United States Food Security Act of 1985, security interests in farm products cannot be protected.

Agricultural leaders in Maine strongly advocate the establishment of such a central file, and they, as well as other officials, contend that the availability of farm financing in Maine is jeopardized with a filing system. This legislative document authorizes the Secretary of State to develop and operate the central filing system, and an appropriation to implement the necessary action.

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
