LD AN ACT TO DENY CERTAIN STATE FUNDS TO ANY PL 1987
11 PERSON WHO REFUSED TO REGISTER UNDER THE UNITED C. 142
STATES MILITARY SELECTIVE SERVICES ACT

Sponsor: PARADIS, Racine, Erwin, E. Committee Report: OTP (Majority)
ONTP (Minority)

Amendments Adopted: H-83 BROWN

SUMMARY: This bill would deny State funds to persons who are required to register for Selective Service but fail to do so. The funds affected are the Blaine House Scholars Program, the Maine Osteopathic Loan Program, the Post-Graduate Health Profession Program and the Maine Student Incentive Grant Program.

House Amendment "A" (H-83) made a technical correction.

Senate Amendment "A" (S-449) (not adopted) would make the denial of funds go into effect only if there were less than 90% compliance with Selective Service Registration in Maine.

LD AN ACT RELATING TO THE FORFEITURE OF UNOCCUPIED ONTP
38 INTERMENT SPACES

Sponsor: DUTREMBLE Committee Report: ONTP

SUMMARY: This bill would have provided that unoccupied cemetery lots for which the owner of record has not provided for the care and maintenance for 50 years would be forfeited to the person or organization that owns and maintains the cemetery. The owner of the cemetery would resell the lots after at least attempting to notify the owner of the unoccupied lots that money is owing for care and maintenance.
