SUMMARY: LD 92 proposed to allow individuals to qualify for unemployment compensation benefits even if the individual refused work on a shift from 9 A.M. to 5 P.M. so long as the refusal was based on a need to care for an immediate family member whose physician certified the need for care.

LD 105 AN ACT TO ENSURE CONFIDENTIAL AND RELIABLE SUBSTANCE ABUSE TESTING OF EMPLOYEES (REPORTED PURSUANT TO RESOLVE CHAPT. 86 OF 1985) ND LD 1400

SUMMARY: LD 105 was the suggested legislation of the Minority of the Commission to Examine Chemical Testing of Employees. It proposed to allow employers to require employees and applicants to submit to substance abuse testing as provided in a written policy adopted by the employer. Confirmation tests were required before disciplinary action could be taken upon any positive test result.
