LD AN ACT TO PROVIDE STATUTORY AUTHORITY FOR
210 ALCOHOL AND DRUG EDUCATION IN MAINE.

SUMMARY: This bill would have established in statute the role of the Department of Environmental and Cultural Services in the area of drug education. At the hearing on the bill, the committee learned that the Audit and Program Review Committee had studied the field of drug education and was making a similar recommendation in its bill.

LD AN ACT RELATING TO THE ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL
227 OF THE UNIVERSITY OF MAINE SYSTEM.

SUMMARY: This bill removes any reference found in current law to the administrative council of the University of Maine System. The Council as a body no longer carries out the same functions as when the University System was created, so the language referring to the Council is now obsolete. This bill passed with House Amendment "A," which merely corrects a technical problem.

LD AN ACT TO CHANGE THE LAW GOVERNING SCHOOL
229 ENTRANCE AGE.

LVWD

Sponsor: DIAMOND, Handy, Estes, Randall
Committee Report: LVWD

SUMMARY: This bill would have changed the date by which a child entering kindergarten must turn 5 or a child entering first grade must turn 6, from October 15th of the year they enter school, to May 1st of the preceding school year. The committee recommended passage of LD 1505 creating the Special Commission to Study School Entrance Age.
