SUMMARY: The bill seeks to grant immunity from civil or criminal liability in an action brought by a licensee for any member of a peer review committee of a state psychological association, any staff member of such an association, and any witness or consultant presenting information to the peer review committee. The immunity applies only if the member, staff, witness, or consultant acted in good faith within the scope of the committee's function.

LD AN ACT TO ENABLE PARENTS TO BE EMANCIPATED 597 FROM PARENTAL OR GUARDIAN RESPONSIBILITY

LVWD

Sponsor: ROLDE

Committee Report: LVWD

SUMMARY: This bill would have provided a mechanism for parents to petition the court for emancipation of a juvenile who is at least 16 years of age. Upon the effective date of such an order, the parents would no longer have been held liable for any act of that child.

LD AN ACT TO INCLUDE THE TERM SEXUAL ORIENTATION 602 IN THE MAINE HUMAN RIGHTS ACT

H-INDEF PP S-ACC RPT MAJ (ONTP) REP

Committee Report: ONTP

SUMMARY: The bill sought to amend the Maine Human Rights Act to prohibit discrimination based on sexual orientation in employment, housing, public accommodations, and credit.

LD AN ACT TO CHANGE THE LOCATION OF DISTRICT COURT PL 1987
606 FOR THE MUNICIPALITY OF WAYNE TO AUGUSTA c. 21

Sponsor: DAVIS, JR., MacBride, Vose, Dow Committee Report: New Draft of LD 108

<u>SUMMARY:</u> The original bill, LD 108, proposed to move the location for District Court for the municipality of Wayne from Waterville to Livermore Falls.

Because Livermore Falls is located in a different County than Wayne, the new draft, LD 606, relocates the District Court for Wayne to Augusta.

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
