LD AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE INCREASE OF THE MAXIMUM 734 SPEED LIMIT TO 65 MILES PER HOUR.

PL 1987 c. 257 EMERGENCY

Amendments Adopted: H-212 COMMITTEE H-252 CLARK H

<u>SUMMARY:</u> The bill allows the Commissioner of Transportation to establish a speed limit of 65 miles per hour on the Maine Turnpike or on the interstate highways in the State.

Committee Amendment A (H-212) adds an emergency preamble and emergency clause to allow the bill to go into effect when approved. It also establishes a minimum fine of \$50.

House Amendment B to Committee Amendment A (H-252) amends an existing statutory provision limiting school buses to 45 miles per hour when transporting students to and from school. It added a limitation of 55 miles per hour for school buses at all other times, for example, transporting students to athletic events.

LD AN ACT TO CREATE A MUNICIPAL DESIGNATION OF ONTP

Sponsor: ROLDE

Committee Report: ONTP

SUMMARY: The bill would have provided a procedure whereby a municipality could have designated any state aid highway or municipal road as a scenic road. The designation of a road as a scenic road would have limited the manner in which trees could be cut along the roadway.

LD AN ACT TO CLARIFY STANDARDS FOR TRANSFER OF LVWD 783 TITLE OF MOTOR VEHICLES.

Sponsor: BRANNIGAN, Pouliot Committee Report: LVWD

<u>SUMMARY:</u> The bill would have clarified the provisions by which certificate of title are transferred and would have made a lienholder's failure to comply a civil violation.
