LD 825 AN ACT PERTAINING TO THE PLACING OF BEAR BAIT. ND LD 1620

Sponsor: JACQUES, Greenlaw, Duffy, Clark H  
Committee Report: OTP-ND LD 1620

LD 893 AN ACT TO EXTEND THE FRESHWATER FISHING SEASON ONTP  
FOR NONGAME FISH IN SOUTHERN MAINE.

Sponsor: GREENLAW  
Committee Report: ONTP

SUMMARY: The open season for bass, pickerel and perch for all waters within York, Cumberland and Oxford counties would have been extended through the month of October through this bill. The sponsor felt that many of the lakes in this region could support a few extra days of fishing in October.

The Department opposed this bill on the grounds that a blanket approval of fishing in these waters was not sound management. They proposed dealing with specific lakes and waters through the regulatory process.

LD 902 AN ACT TO BAN WATERSKIING ON CERTAIN PARTS OF LVWD  
THE SACO RIVER.

Sponsor: WARREN, Duffy, Smith  
Committee Report: LVWD

SUMMARY: This bill proposed to ban waterskiing on the Saco River. Because the river is over 400 feet wide, the boating safety rules allow waterskiing. The waterskiiers have set up a regulation slalom course on the river in years past. The Department has issued a waiver to allow skiing over to one side of the river, rather than down the center channel. This has been done to minimize conflicts with navigation and as a safety precaution. There have been major conflicts among riverfront landowners and waterskiiers. The Committee felt this issue was best resolved at a local level by the parties involved.
