SUMMARY: LD 1186 requires the members of the Maine Turnpike Authority and the Executive Director of the Maine Turnpike Authority to be appointed by the Governor, reviewed by the Transportation Committee and confirmed by the Senate.

An amendment to this bill removed the confirmation process for the Executive Director of the Maine Turnpike Authority. The Executive Director serves at the pleasure of the authority.

LDAN ACT TO ALLOW THE TREASURER OF STATE TO VOTEPL 19871203ON CERTAIN STATE BOARDSc. 403

<u>SUMMARY:</u> LD 1203 changes the status of the State Treasurer from a non-voting member to a voting member on 4 boards:

- A. Board of Trustees, Finance Authority of Maine
- B. Maine School Building Authority
- C. Maine Health and Higher Educational Facilities Authority
- D. Board of Directors, Maine State Housing Authority

The Treasurer of the State had voting status on the Board of Trustees, Maine State Retirement prior to the introduction of LD 1203, so that provision was removed from the original bill by the Committee amendment.

The intent of LD 1203 is to put weight behind the expertise of the State Treasurer with respect to the boards on which he serves as a non-voting member. According to the State Treasurer, the treasurer and his office have substantial experience and expertise in bond financing as well as investments that should be considered in the decision-making process.
