LD AN ACT CONCERNING THE REQUIREMENTS OF 1426 PRACTICING LAW

Sponsor: WARREN, Gauvreau, Bustin, Racine Committee Report: LVWD

SUMMARY: This bill sought to require each practicing attorney to accept at least one pro bono case per year. The attorney would not have been able to renew his license without proof of this acceptance.

LDAN ACT TO AMEND THE MAINE JUVENILE CODE TOPL 19871429PROVIDE GREATER FLEXIBILITY IN SENTENCINGc. 297JUVENILE OFFENDERSC. 297

SUMMARY: Under the Juvenile Code as it existed prior to the enactment of this bill, the Juvenile Court could impose incarceration of up to 30 days in a county jail facility only if an underlying commitment to the Maine Youth Center was ordered. The bill allows the Juvenile Court the added option of imposing a county jail sentence of up to 30 days without requiring an underlying sentence to the Youth Center.

LD AN ACT TO INCREASE FINANCIAL SUPPORT FROM LVWD 1450 PARENTS OF CHILDREN IN THE CARE OR CUSTODY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES

Sponsor: McPHERSON, Maybury, Whitmore, Macomber Committee Report: LVWD

SUMMARY: The bill sought to require a court ordering custody of a child to someone other than a parent under the divorce laws, Juvenile Code, or the Child and Family Services and Child Protection Act, to order the parents to pay child support if the court finds they have the ability to pay.

SUMMARY: The bill permits the Attorney General, a deputy attorney general, or a district attorney to seek court-ordered access to records of interstate
