LD AN ACT TO PROHIBIT CANDIDATES FROM RECEIVING, ND LD 1712  
1433 WITNESSING OR ACCEPTING ABSENTEE BALLOTS

LD AN ACT CONCERNING THE SALE OF CERTAIN LVWD  
1444 FIRECRACKERS

Sponsor: RANDALL, Look, Whitmore, Telow  
Committee Report: LVWD

SUMMARY: This bill would legalize the sale of certain fireworks called "snappers" or "bangsnaps," which make a snapping sound when dropped.

LD AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A 10% SURTAX ON FINES TO BE CARRY-OVER  
1452 DEDICATED TO THE MAINE CRIMINAL JUSTICE ACADEMY  
IN LIEU OF TUITION PAID BY MUNICIPALITIES

Sponsor: VOSE, Gwadosky, Jacques  
Committee Report: Carry-Over

SUMMARY: This bill would provide funding for the Maine Criminal Justice Academy by placing a 10% surtax on fines. The amounts would be deposited into a dedicated fund for the use of the Academy; any surplus would go into the General Fund.

The Legal Affairs Committee will carry-over this bill and LD 790, and will study the issues in the interim to make recommendations for next session.

LD AN ACT TO AMEND THE LIQUOR LICENSING LAWS PL 1987  
1466 c. 151

Sponsor: BLACK, Dillenback, Lord, Ruhlin  
Committee Report: New Draft of LD 27

SUMMARY: The original bill would allow incorporated civic organizations to hold up to 6 events licensed for the sale of liquor per year. The bill did not address the duration of each event, nor did it make all the changes necessary to increase the number of events from one event annually under current law, to the proposed 6 events.

The New Draft adds 4 additional licenses to current law. Each new license will be valid for only 1 day, and the licenses may not be used for consecutive days.
