LD AN ACT REQUIRING THAT INFORMED CONSENT BE GIVEN PL 1987  
1490 TO THOSE PERSONS TESTED FOR THE PRESENCE OF c. 443  
ANTIBODIES TO HTLV-III

H-325 COMMITTEE

SUMMARY: This bill, as amended, requires informed consent prior to administering the HIV antibody test. This bill enacts the following provisions concerning informed consent:

1. It adds a definition of informed consent.
2. It requires individuals give their written informed consent to the test except when the test is done for research purposes or for donations of human body parts.
3. It adds a section defining anonymous testing sites established by the Department of Human Services and exempts the anonymous testing sites from the requirement that the informed consent be in writing.
4. It requires insurers who require HIV tests to submit the written informed consent of the applicant on forms approved by the Superintendent of Insurance.
5. It adds a requirement for post-test counseling.

In addition, this bill makes two technical changes to the Chapter: (1) it changes the designation of the virus from "HTLV-III" to "HIV" and it reallocates the entire chapter of law concerning AIDS from §§17001 - 17006 (PART 20) to §§19201 - 19206 (PART 22). Two other bills were enacted by the Legislature this year amending this chapter (LD 1515 and LD 1538). They are included in this reallocation to avoid conflicting statutes.

SUMMARY: This bill requires specific performance standards for resident evacuations in fire drills in boarding care facilities.
