SUMMARY: LD 815 proposed to provide to local economic development corporations within areas of sudden or severe economic dislocation roughly 3 grants of no more than \$25,000 per grant within each year of the 1987-89 biennium. These grants could also be provided to local economic development corporations in areas threatened with severe economic dislocation.

The bill defined a sudden or severe economic dislocation as a major industrial plant closing or work force reduction resulting in a loss of 30% of the areas industrial jobs.

The new draft provided for the allocation of the necessary funds of \$75,000 per year from the State Contingency Fund. The new draft also broadens the type of group that may participate in the allocation of funds to areas suffering from or threatened with severe economic dislocation.
