SUMMARY: The original bill sought to prohibit all vehicles over 1000 pounds from the ice of any reservoirs or public water supplies. The weight restriction was felt to be somewhat arbitrary and unworkable by the Committee.

The new draft allows for municipalities, water utilities and water districts to petition the Department to develop regulations for water supply protection. These rules are required to be at least as stringent as those already in effect. The bill also sets forth penalties for violating these regulations. The Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife was given jurisdiction over these regulations in order not to unnecessarily infringe on recreational use of these water bodies.

SUMMARY: This bill regulates the placing and use of bear bait to minimize conflicts during the bear season. This bill specifies that bait sites be out of sight, tagged, away from dumps, campgrounds and dwellings, and cleaned up after the season. The bill also requires persons to have permission if hunting from the stand or blind of another. The new draft clarifies many of the requirements in the original bill and deletes a section relating to nonresidents.
